Administrative history / Biographical sketch

Note

Born November 26, 1924 in Detroit, Michigan, Angela Marie Aubert was the daughter of Joseph Telesphore "Ted" Aubert (d. 1936) and Helen Benesch (d. 1971). She had one brother. She was raised in Wildwood, Alberta and attended high school there. In 1945, Angela Aubert moved to Edmonton to enroll in business and secretarial studies at McTavish Business College. She then began a career as a secretary in Edmonton. It was at this time that she felt a call to religious life and on August 25, 1948, she was received into the Community of the Sisters of St. Joseph at Sacred Heart Convent in London, Ontario and given the name Sister Marie Angela. After her first vows on August 25, 1950, she returned to Edmonton where she took teacher training at the University of Alberta, graduating in 1951. Sister Marie Angela Aubert professed her final vows on August 25, 1954 in London. Her first assignment, until 1957, was at the Catholic school in St. Bride's, Alberta where she was a teacher, then principal. From 1957 to 1961, Sister Marie Angela Aubert was assigned to the business office at St. Joseph's Hospital in Galahad, Alberta. After she returned to teach at St. Nicholas School in Edmonton until 1964. Then she was asked to teach business and religion at O'Leary High School. As head of the business department, she encouraged her students to manage a real business in the classroom under the sponsorship of Junior Achievement. The students had great success, even winning awards and a chance to go to Vancouver to compete in the Junior Achievement national competition. She finished her Bachelor of Education studies, graduating in 1969, from the University of Alberta. In 1971, Sister Marie Angela Aubert returned to London, Ontario as head of the business department at Mount St. Joseph Academy, and in 1975, was assigned to Catholic Central High School. While teaching there from 1975 to 1978, she supervised the Catholic Central High School Business Club and received the Catholic Central High School Business Club award. When Mount St. Joseph Academy closed, the facility was opened as a Guest Wing for those who had a family member as a patient in University Hospital, and Sister Marie Angela Aubert was appointed treasurer. During those years, she volunteered at the jail, participated in the Toastmistress Club, initiated self-Bible study, and

turned Gospel stories into plays. She also maintained an interest in social justice, reaching out to the least fortunate and forgotten. In 1985 and 1987, the Ministry of Corrections gave her service awards for her volunteer work at the Elgin-Middlesex Detention Centre where she was the Coordinator of R. C. [Roman Catholic] Jail Ministry Volunteers. In 1991, she was moved to Ignatia Hall Infirmary and then to the care centre at 485 Windermere Road when it was built in 2007. Sister Marie Angela Aubert died there on January 17, 2008. A Mass of Resurrection was held in St. Joseph Chapel at the 485 Windermere Road residence. She is buried at St. Peter's Cemetery in London.

Custodial history

The records were transferred to the archives upon the death of Sister Marie Angela Aubert.

Scope and content

This sous-fonds contains material created and amassed by Sister Marie Angela Aubert. Sister Marie Angela Aubert was a writer of poetry, articles, poems and more and much of that material is included here. The scripts, records, and correspondence about the over 140 plays she wrote inspired by the Bible are present. A notable inclusion is **The Great Adventure**, a play written and produced by Sister Marie Angela Aubert for the 125th Anniversary of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of London. There is also correspondence with the Bishops of London granting her plays Imprimatur and Nihil Obstat, which means that the content of the plays was found to be in keeping with the teachings of the Church, are of good quality, and can be published. Her work was also included in **Fine Lines: 1997 Anthology** and **Fine Lines II: 1998 Anthology** by London & Area Writers. Both books are within this sous-fonds. In addition, there are various serial publications and clippings present which feature Sister Marie Angela Aubert's poems, plays, reflections on her life and religious experiences, articles on education, and Letters to the Editor. There is also a research paper she wrote on the impact of Christianity in a detention centre. Sister Marie Angela Aubert was the Coordinator of R.C. [Roman Catholic] Jail Ministry Volunteers and the scripts for communion services at Elgin-Middlesex Detention Centre are present here, too. The sous-fond also includes certificates, diplomas, transcripts, and teaching licenses presented to and earned by Sister Marie Angela Aubert, including her B.A. diploma from the University of Windsor and B.Ed. diploma from the University of Alberta. Sister Marie Angela Aubert spent much of her life as a teacher. While working at O'Leary High School she got the students involved in the Junior Achievements Program and at Catholic Central High School she supervised the CCH Business Club. Newsletters, administrative documents, correspondence, photographs, newspaper clippings, correspondence, and an article written by her from these two programs are included in this sous-fonds. There are also invitations, awards lists, and thank-you notes from Sister Marie Angela Aubert's time at these schools.

Scope and content: Sister Marie Angela Aubert wrote over 140 short plays while she was treasurer for the Guest Wing at the University Hospital in London, Ontario. This series contains correspondence concerning the plays, scripts, and recordings of performances. The plays cover a wide variety of religious subjects such as the Passion, the Immaculate Conception, Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, and many other stories from the Bible. 140 of the plays are specifically inspired by the Good News Bible. Some of the scripts are annotated with the names of the actors. There is also "Make the Bible Come Alive," a pamphlet with five scripts of Sister Marie Angela Aubert's plays. 140 of the plays were granted Imprimatur and Nihil Obstat, which means the content of the plays has been deemed of good standard and in keeping with the teachings of the Church. The letters from the Bishop of London, the Most Rev. John M. Sherlock, D.D., and Rev. J. Murray Watson, M. Div. granting these declarations are present. For more information on this, see F01-SF05-S002. Accompanying the computer disks are two letters, one from Sr. Patricia Edward, FSP and one from "Brad" concerning the return of the disks.

Scope and content: This series contains correspondence with the Bishop of London concerning the doctrinal and moral content of 140 of the short plays written by Sister Marie Angela Aubert. For more information on the plays, see F01-SF05-S002. Most Rev. John M. Sherlock, Bishop of London, asked Rev. J. Murray Watson, M. Div, to become Sister Marie Angela Aubert's Censor Librorum, an authority who reviews text for the Church. Father J. Murray Watson granted Sister Marie Angela Aubert's plays Nihil Obstat in 1996. Nihil Obstat is an official declaration that the text contains no doctrinal or moral errors and is in keeping with the teachings and views of the Church. It was issued again in 1997. In 1997, Bishop Sherlock also granted the plays Imprimatur. Imprimatur authorizes the publication of material and guarantees that the content is of good standard. The plays were reviewed in 2006 with Rev. Michael Prieur acting as Censor Librorum and the Bishop of London at the time, Most Rev. Ronald P. Fabbro, C.S.B., again granted Imprimatur with a recommendation for a minor revision to play #144. The letters detailing these events are present.

Scope and content: This series contains various written material by Sister Marie Angela Aubert that was published; including poems, plays, articles, and reflections on her life and religious experiences. Her work was included in *Fine Lines: 1997 Anthology* and *Fine Lines II: 1988 Anthology*, published by London & Area Writers in London, Ontario. London & Area Writers was a group dedicated to supporting local writers. Both books include works from Sister Marie Angela Aubert and 23 other local writers. Sister Marie Angela's work in *Fine Lines: 1997 Anthology* includes "My Gift," "Why I Joined the Sisters of St. Joseph," "Mother Lives Her Greatest Adventure," "My Guardian Angel Saved My Life," and "Jesus Heals a Leper." Sister Marie Angela's work in *Fine Lines II: 1998 Anthology* includes "A Bridge to Resurrection," "My Taste of Wildwood's Winter Wonder(?)land," "Love Your Enemies," and "A Woman of Great Faith." Some of these works were previously published in *Companion Magazine*, *Canadian Messenger of the Sacred Heart*, and *The Catholic Register* (a weekly paper). Also included is *Canadian Messenger of the Sacred Heart* October 1995, Vol. 105, No. 9 featuring Sister Marie Angela Aubert's "My Guardian Angel Saved My Life." There are also clippings of her publications from various sources. This includes duplications of some of the previously listed works and "A Prayer for the Old Folks at the Personal Care," "Experiment in Student Business Management, 1970" from *The Journal of Business Education*, and "Hospital life: Some Lighter Vignettes."

Scope and content: This series contains two slightly different versions of the research paper *Fulfilling the Need for Christian Personal Presence in a Detention Centre* by Sister Marie Angela Aubert. The paper examines the treatment and depersonalization of inmates and how a Christian presence can help inmates to reflect and grow. The paper was written for a religious studies class she was attending at “UW” which is assumed to be the University of Windsor where she graduated with her B.A. in 1984, the same year this paper was written. The course was taught by Professor M. Carlene Garlatti who marked one of the versions of the paper. Sister Marie Angela Aubert was very engaged with detention centres and volunteered as the Coordinator of R.C. [Roman Catholic] Jail Ministry Volunteers to Elgin-Middlesex Detention Centre in London, Ontario.

Scope and content: This series contains material related to Sister Marie Angela Aubert's involvement in high schools and education. She spent much of her life working as a teacher at various institutions. Much of the material present here concerns her involvement with the Catholic Central High School (CCH) Business Club, the Junior Achievement Program at O'Leary High School, and her articles on education. Sister Marie Angela Aubert taught at Catholic Central High School in London, Ontario and supervised the CCH Business Club. The club's primary focus was doing typing for students, teachers, and school publications like the *Knightrider Magazine* and the yearbook. The club was also involved in fundraising activities and arranged for speakers to come to the school and give talks about business, education, and employer expectations. Material in this series related to the CCH Business Club's includes the CCH Business Club's newsletters, invitations, memorandums, member lists, a goal list, and an article about the club written by Sister Marie Angela Aubert. Sister Marie Angela taught business and religion at O'Leary High School in Edmonton, Alberta and there she involved the grade 12 Business Management class in the Junior Achievement Program, a program aimed at teaching youth entrepreneurship and business skills. As part of the program, students developed companies to promote and operate. The students created Gemco, which sold handmade jewelry, and J. A. Enterprise, which sold personalized mugs. Material related to the Junior Achievement Program includes material from displays, correspondence, weekly sales summaries, photographs, and news clippings of coverage of the program and advertisements. There are also invitations to banquets, awards lists, and thank-you notes from Sister Marie Angela's time at these schools. This series also includes five educational serial publications with articles written by Sister Marie Angela. There are four issues of *Contact* (November/December, 1977; March/April, 1979; January/February, 1980; and November/December, 1981), which was a quarterly service publication of Gage Education Publishing, Ltd. sent free of charge to all business and economics teachers in Canada. Sister Marie Angela's articles are "A New Method of Teaching Introductory Accounting," "Producing Class Magazine Is Exciting Typing Motivation," "Creativity Should Be Encouraged, Not Stifled," and "Is it 'IE' or 'EI? ALICE' Helps!" Also in this series is *Synoptic*, Spring 1979, Vol. XIX, No. 2, a publication of the Business Education Council of Alberta Teachers' Association which features Sister Marie Angela's article "Involvement in Toastmistress Club Enhances Communications Teaching."
